Nebulizers



A nebulizer changes

medication from a liquid to a mist so that it can be easily inhaled into the lungs.

Nebulizers are effective in delivering asthma medication to infants and small children and to anyone who has difficulty using an asthma inhaler. It is also convenient when a large dose of an inhaled medication is needed.

Nebulized therapy is often referred to as a "breathing treatment."

Spacers/Holding Chambers

Spacers/holding chambers are used with metered dose inhalers. They help by allowing the patient to take in the medication slower therefore almost eliminating the coughing that can occur with rapid inhalation and the possible loss of medication before its absorbed. Available with and without a mask.









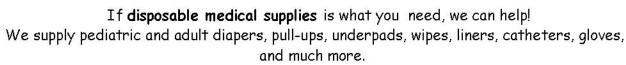


BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

HOW TO ROAST PUMPKIN SEEDS

Part of the fun of pumpkin carving is roasting and eating the seeds. Here's How:



- 1. Scoop the seeds of our pumpkin into a bowl. Clean the seeds as soon as possible in cold water. It is easier to clean them when they are still wet from the inside of the pumpkin.

- 4. Spray a light coating of non-stick cooking spray

- 6. Bake at 325 degrees for about 25 minutes.
